

## SECTION C – FARM PRODUCTS

All Exhibits in the class must be grown by the exhibitor in the current year, except corn which must have been grown last year. **Pointers on selecting horticulture products:** General Score Card for Horticulture Products.

**Condition 35:** Specimens should be clean, bright and free of blemishes, disease or injury.

**Uniformity 15:** Specimens should be uniform in size, maturity, form, color and condition.

**Form 15:** Form should be typical of the variety, regular and smooth. Do not use misshapen specimens.

**Size 10:** Specimens should be such that it is usable on the table and would sell easily at the market place. Very large or very small specimens rate low.

**Color 15:** Color should be typical of the variety and uniform throughout.

**Important Points to Know in Selecting Specific Horticulture Products:**

**Onions** - The skin should be clean and bright, uniform in color and free from stain. The skin should not be broken and the outer skin must not be removed. The neck should be small and dry. This indicates proper ripening and good keeping quality. The specimens should be solid, crisp and well matured.

**Potatoes** – Potatoes that weight from 6 to 12 ounces are the best size. They should be true to variety and uniform in type, quality and size.

**Beets** – A good show beet should be about 2 inches in diameter, smooth, well-shaped for the variety and firm. The flesh should show a deep dark red color. White rings are undesirable.

**Apples** – Fruit should be free from insects, disease and mechanical injury. The color should extend well down in the basal end. Missing stems should be scored against. Place of apples will be judged by the following

score: **Form....15 pts    Size....10 pts    Uniformity....25 pts    Color....15 pts    Condition....25 pts**
